Reviewed venues

Stroud

Atelier Stroud - the top half of the workshop space is accessible (there are two steps down to the bottom half).

Cashes Green Community Centre - step free access and wide doors. We think it also has a disabled/accessible toilet.

Costa Coffee - lower section is all on one floor, with accessible toile**t**

Curio Lounge - door opens outwards so difficult to open if in wheelchair/scooter, meeting must be downstairs to be accessible.

Old Town Hall - accessible but with some restrictions - full report can be found here - https://stroudtown.gov.uk/wp-content/uploads/Old-Town-Hall-Access-Audit-without-recommendations.pdf

The Exchange, Brick Row - all on one floor, wheelchair ramp, accessible toilet. Heavy fire door into the Meeting Room opens outwards so difficult to open if in wheelchair/scooter. http://www.theexchangestroud.org.uk/octavia-hill-meeting-room/

The Imperial Hotel, Stroud - step free access via side door in conference room but no accessible toilet

Lansdown Hall - the top room needs someone to open the side door - from experience staff at the building are pretty good about getting people in the side



door if they know in advance. There should be a building upgrade this summer that will make it much more accessible.

The Library - accessible, has a lift

The Pavillion in the Park, Cainscross, Victory Park - http://www.cainscross-pc.gov.uk/hew-hall.html £10 per hour not for profit, contact clerk@cainscross-pc.gov.uk newly built, all on one floor

Prince Albert Pub, Rodborough – technically access is possible via the side gate and internal door but door is narrow and there is no accessible toilet. Suitable for short meetings if no other venue is available. http://www.accessglos.co.uk/prince-albert-inn/

Randwick Village Hall - step free access and accessible toilet

Randwick Scout Hut - access is good, not much parking, on the 67 bus route http://randwickscouts.org.uk/hall-hire/

St Laurence's Church – steps into Church but ramp available, open space inside, toilet in Church Hall opposite. http://www.accessglos.co.uk/st-laurence-church/

St Laurence's Church Hall - ramped entrance from Church graveyard with accessible toilet on the right inside the first set of doors. http://www.accessglos.co.uk/st-laurence-church/

Sub Rooms - technically accessible but if you want to go upstairs you have to tell the Sub Rooms in advance so that they can answer the door bell by the lift.

Ale House - there is a side entrance, but it would need someone on the inside to open door.

The Beacon - inaccessible. Initial responses when enquiries were made by a scooter user "was very poor, it was me making a fuss not them...and that's not unusual."

Centre for Science and Art - steps into the building, no ramp

Congregational Church - entrance is narrow and possibly not suitable for scooter, a scooter user has been advised that they can go through another room if it was not in use.

Silver Rooms Cafe (next door to Launderette) - steps to get in and inside the cafe itself.
